




in Taekwon do.

As the Officers and Flag Bearers prepared to enter the Chapel of stately Benedict Castle, the sun shared a gentle kiss and a cool breeze with the echo of Bagpipes in the distance. The joint Investiture commenced with the flags, officers and members of the Imperial and Charitable Order of Constantine the Great and Saint Helen processing into the chapel followed by the Supreme Council of the United States of the Hospitaler Order of Saint Lazarus.

As Sir Bradley Niederhauser, Prior for California, made the announcements of Officers, the procession of flags of the Order were brought to the Alter and posted in international protocol arrayed behind the flag





of the United Nations. First came the Stars and Stripes, then the flags of Canada and the State of California. The flag of the Byzantine Empire heralded the arrival of the banners of Saint Helen, -of the Grand Prior of the USA, and of the Order of Constantine the Great. Each flag was followed by the Officers and members represented. The Sword and the Spurs - visual reminders of our chivalric historywere heraldically presented.



On this day, His Grace Michael Teilmann, Grand Prior General of the Order, conferred the title of "Dame" on two Ladies, Elsa Taledara & Priscilla Pryk. The ladies to be invested were draped with the mantle of Saint Helen, and our GPG touched their shoulders with the Baton of Saint Helen. Dame Commander, LeeAnn Quiroz, Grand Dame of Saint Helen in the USA officiated during the ceremony by administering the solemn Oath of Saint Helen and presenting the official decorations. The ceremonies continued with the knighting of five gentlemen, Sirs Adam Buttons, Alex Jubitz, Edgar Taledara, Sonny Robison and Richard Therrien, ESQ. H.G. Michael Teilmann invested the new knights with an Excalibur Sword in a ceremony basically unchanged from the original knighting of his warriors done in the year 312 by Constantine the Great.

As they rose from the kneeling rail as Knights of the Imperial and Charitable Order of Constantine the Great, His Excellency John Quiroz, Grand Prior of the Order for the United States, swore them to their Oath of Allegience. As Knights, they repeated the solemn words and swore to uphold the values of knighthood and allegiance to the Imperial and Charitable Order of Constantine the Great and Saint





Helen. The Invocation and prayer of absolution were given by His Grace Russell Fritz, Grand Exarch of the Order of St. Eugene of Trebizon.

Once the Order's Investiture ceremony was concluded, the Grand Prior General took his place on the dais, and the St Lazarus ceremony began. Our own Grand Prior of the USA, and Grand Dame of St Helen in the USA were awarded Medals of Merit from St Lazarus for their dedication and diligence as liaisons between the two Orders.

The evening concluded with a magnificent formal banquet in the courtyard of Benedict Castle.
